This week we have continued our term's value of Joy with some fantastic enrichment experiences for our children. We welcomed Bethany the School Programmes Officer from the Engineering Development Trust to complete a STEM workshop with Year 5 & 6 pupils. STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics activities spark children's curiosity about the natural world, encouraging them to explore and ask questions. Engaging in STEM helps children develop problem-solving abilities. Bethany's workshop had a hands-on approach to connect theoretical concepts to real-world scenarios. They learned to analyse situations, think critically, and find creative solutions. Children were able to better understand how STEM knowledge applies beyond the classroom and gave them a really fun and challenging morning.

Squirrel class welcomed Altru Creative Education in to learn more about their history topic using drama and the arts to educate and inspire children and to provide high quality creative opportunities with a lasting impact. Year 1 & 2 pupils enjoyed an action-packed day learning about seaside holidays of the past. In the morning, they took part in an exciting and engaging drama workshop and throughout the rest of the day they created an information led performance with music which included Seaside holidays in Victorian times, activities at the seaside, Holiday clothing of the past, Holiday entertainment (including theatre and puppet shows), Introduction of Butlins and UK holiday parks, the advancement of foreign travel in the 1960s, and Victorian transport - a lot of learning and very engaging day for the children.- thank you Miss Thomas and Miss Hunter for organising.

We then finished the week with a Euro inspired Football coaching sessions with coach Cameron, for all of Otter and Badger class, followed by inspirational gymnast Elizabeth who worked with Butterflies, Bumblebees and Squirrels linked to the Olympics.

The summer solstice is the longest day of the year - it's the day of the year that we get the most amount of sunlight. In the northern hemisphere (where the UK is) it happens on Thursday 20 June. The summer solstice marks the end of spring and the official start of summer. Solstice comes from the Latin word solstitium. 
