Understanding how our learning has a place in the real world, led Miss Jones to take part in a live science lesson with a farm in Wales! This was facilitated by the NFU and allowed the children to understand the process on farms in terms of milking cows to make certain dairy based products. It taught us about the importance of Science in many jobs and careers but also how it is vital in the world we live in. The children also listened to a talk from a scientist who investigates how to reduce methane production from cows to try to prevent climate change. The children were fascinated to learn that even cows can contribute to the changes within our planet and that there are many roles that people can take to help this cause.
