Dear Parents and Carers,

This week in worship we discussed a powerful concept that can make a significant difference to each child's learning journey: **the power of "yet."** The power of "yet" is a simple but transformative mindset that encourages children to embrace challenges and view their abilities as something that can grow with effort and perseverance. Instead of saying "I can't do this," we encourage them to say "I can't do this **yet.**" We believe that this small shift in language fosters a growth mindset, helping children understand that their abilities can improve over time with practice and dedication. To help us develop a positive mindset to learning, encourage your child by using phrases like "You can't do it yet, but with practice, you'll get there!" This reinforces the idea that their abilities can grow.


Harvest - Food bank donations


