Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to a new half-term. It has been lovely to see so many enriched learning taking place around the school. Our school motto of shine bright and reach for the stars is derived from the bible verse Matthew 5:16 - 'Let your light shine amongst others, so they may see the good works that you do'. Click here to find out more. As a Church school we look for the theme of light in all subjects, and other religions.

Learning about various religions helps children understand and respect the beliefs and practices of others, and on Monday our children learnt all about the Hindu festival of light - Diwali. Diwali symbolises the victory of light over darkness. During Diwali, people light rows of traditional clay oil lamps called Diyas outside their homes - so our worship leaders created a beautiful display in our hall for worship this morning. We listened to the story of Rama and Sita and lit a Diya lamp alongside our worship candle. With the seasons changing and the nights drawing in, we are learning more about the world around us at night time in Squirrel class. A part of our value of Nurture, it is also really important for our children to understand our wildlife, so that they can take care of them for future generations. On Wednesday we welcomed Steve from Shropshire Falconry into school to learn more about Owls. We met a Barn Owl, a Tawny Owl, a little Owl and a Milky Eagle Owl. We learnt about their habitat, what they eat, how and why they fly silently. Steve very kindly let us hold some of the Owls and we were able to watch them fly! What a wonderful learning experience for our children and adults!

Our Safety Guardians job is to ensure that they organise talks and events throughout they to educate our children on how to keep themselves and others safe. This week they have organised a Fire Safety talk from local Fireman Andrew to talk to

our children about how to keep safe around fire and what to do in an emergency. Thank you so much Shropshire
