Enquiry based learning: - A mysterious suitcase appeared in Squirrels class this week. We asked lots of questions and looked for clues to predict who it might belong to. Is it a suitcase from today? Does it belong to a child or an adult? What have they packed? Where are they taking the suitcase?

Adverse weather conditions

In any adverse weather conditions such as snow or ice, we always conduct a thorough risk assessment of the school site and consulting with staff to determine whether it is safe to open the school. The safety of our children and staff is our top priority.

We will always communicate any decisions regarding school closures as soon as possible on Class dojo. To ensure you always receive any updates, ensure your contact information is up to date.

Illness or Medical Appointments

- •You must let us know by 8:50am if your child is too ill to come to school. We need a telephone call for every day of absence.
- Parents are required to inform the school of the reasons for their child's absence. Simply stating 'not in' or 'unwell' gives us insufficient information to make an informed decision, and it may therefore be recorded as unauthorised.
- •Every half-day session absence from school must be classified by the school (not parents/carers) as either authorised or unauthorised. Therefore, information about the cause of each absence is always requested. A full day is equal to two sessions.
- Authorised absences are mornings or afternoons away from school for a good reason (e.g., illness or other unavoidable cause).
- Unauthorised absences are those which the school does not consider reasonable and for which no 'leave' has been given. This includes keeping children off school unnecessarily, absences which have not been properly explained, and children who arrive at school too late to receive a present mark in the register.

If we do not hear from you, we will try to phone you or any of the contacts you have given us.

If we cannot make contact, we will send a text and/or email letting you know that your child is not in school, and that we may make a Safe and Well Check at home.

Medical appointments should be arranged before or after school. If you can't do this, please let us know of all appointments in advance. We can only authorise one session for medical appointments, therefore your child will still be expected to attend school either morning or afternoon, unless exceptional circumstances and previously discussed.
